EFFECTIVENESS IN ACADEMIC ASSIGNMENT

Teaching allows me to make full use of my research interests, background in project management, and interest in interdisciplinary connections both inside and outside the university to maximize student learning outcomes. My focus on high impact curriculum design means I take chances on experimental curriculum and am constantly iterating based on student feedback. Overall, my student evaluation averages are consistently high¹, in Spring of 2019 the Dean of the College of Humanities & Arts wrote of my teaching effectiveness; "Her [Student Evaluation] scores are significantly above the department norms."

This overall success of methodology has been noted by students in their evaluations, particularly in the Summer 2021 collaboration with the San José Museum of Art where students created an interactive exhibit; one student said, "The course was very successful in my opinion, this class was different then other classes I have enrolled in." another said "This class was extremely experimental, she told us that from the beginning, yet despite that caveat it was taught and executed in a really fantastic way." and a third explained "Professor Holberton was willing to help students individually with technical issues as well as more Art Director style issues and led us through the process in creating this exhibit while still giving us plenty of creative freedom."

Student engagement and hands-on learning outcomes are central to the research based collaborative initiatives I've embarked on at SJSU, and will continue to play a central role in my pedagogical philosophy. I want to expose students to challenging techniques and provide professional exposure while centering their experiences and using my project management and media skills to make the content more accessible. In a student review of my Fall 2021 Art 195 BFA Exhibition course a student said, "Rhonda has a plethora of skills and excels at conveying them in a manner that is easy to understand. She constantly engaged with students in a way that demonstrated her passion for the subject as well as the students. At all times I felt like

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Collaboration Across Disciplines

Experimental Collaborative Curriculum: ART 193 & Art 175

I am working on building curriculum that utilizes process-based prototyping to build experimental pipelines of production bridging traditional sculptural processes with emerging Digital CNC Fabrication tools. While CNC tools have become more ubiquitous across academic programs, few campuses have the kinds of specialized fabrication facilities that SJSU possesses. We are uniquely positioned to create new hybrid processes merging metal casting,


kiln-based glass fabrication, ceramics, CNC Routing, and 3D printing. This kind of interdisciplinary digital fabrication is one core component of SJSU's Transformation 2030 strategic plan (Foster cross-disciplinary collaborations that capitalize on the university's signature strengths).

In 2018 I proposed a course, ART 193 Digital Materials, that makes use of some of the Interdisciplinary processes I had developed for the Experimental Media Lab at Stanford University. The course passed the SJSU University Curriculum Committee review, but I have waited to run it because the area that I teach within, Digital Media Art, has only two classrooms and no staff to support the class. Over the past couple of years, I've built relationships with faculty in our Spatial (Sculpture) area and within the Design Department. This past Fall, I garnered support to run the course in collaboration with Ceramics Faculty Adam Shiverdecker & Industrial Design Faculty (and Design Department Chair), Virginia San Fratello. In Spring 2022, I asked one of my MFA students, James Jenkins, to work with the three interdisciplinary faculty mentors to teach Art 193.

In Spring 2020 & Fall 2021 Pictorial Faculty, Shaun O'dell, started discussions about ways our programs could work together. We began to prototype another course bridging Digital Media Art and Painting/Drawing that could run under a rotating special topics course, Art 175. I asked one of MFA students whose studio practice bridges painting, drawing, video, and performance to teach a Digital Drawing course co-supported by the Pictorial and Digital Media Art areas of focus within the Department of Art & Art History.

These two new collaborative classes currently being taught for the first time featured themes and processes I've prototyped within my own studio practice. My recent exhibition, *Piercing the Curtain*, was part of an experimental curatorial project that selected 2 artists living within the San Francisco Bay Area with 2 artists living in Switzerland. We were asked to co-develop two exhibitions out of a series of conversations. My partner was deeply experienced in sculpting, but had little experience using digital tools in his practice. As part of the exchange, I recorded tutorials on 3D scanning and model preparation. Together we tested digital fabrication

& casting techniques. I adapted these methods to create assignments and teaching resources for Art 193.



<u>3D scanning tutorial</u> produced as part of the Binominale Exhibition. I publish most of my tutorials publicly, especially for new processes which are undocumented. As of July 2023 this tutorial has more than 2,600 views.

In Spring of 2022 I submitted a successful proposal for SJSU's Central RSCA Seed Grant that will allow us to experiment with processes at a much larger scale, and across multiple mediums. We will create documentation of best practices and fold these processes into the ART 193 curriculum for Fall 2023 with an eye on creating new curriculum to take advantage of the interdisciplinary collaboration between Art, Design, and beyond.

Integration of Extracurricular Service & Research Activities

In Fall 2020 I taught ART 210, for the first time. Art 210 is a graduate level seminar in Digital Media. I used the opportunity to focus on alternative exhibitions spaces; past, present, and future. I used my research into the historical use of mapping platforms for art exhibitions from the San Jose Story Map (Cal Humanities Grant) coupled with my research into distributed exhibitions facilitated by mail art and social media that I had done for the Wish You Were Here design contest (Internal AEPG Grant) to contextualize discussions explored the interplay of

technology, culture, and economics with exhibition platforms and artists' own practices. We began with a brief history of alternative art spaces focusing on the emergence of many in the 1960s-70s. Then we focused on the ways digital/remote viewership of exhibitions has resulted in everything from white wall galleries in the middle of farms to bedroom galleries in urban centers. The last third focused on the impact of digital platforms; with attention paid to the ways recent events (COVID & Civil Rights Protests) have impacted traditional art markets.

To contextualize the research with contemporary practice; I invited guest curators for artists run exhibition space like Charlie Leese & Marcella Faustini from CLOACA; directors of non-profit institutions like Dena Beard from The Lab; museum curators like Tanya Zimbardo from SFMoMA; and Artists/Entrepreneurs who used their artistic research to develop commercial products like Myco-Works co-founder Sophia Wang. These guests will also be participants in a Public Panel on Alternative Exhibitions presented in conjunction with the opening of the Wish You Were Here Exhibition at the Thompson Gallery. For the ART 210 final project, several students utilized new skills presented in the Wish You Were Here creative workshops; including, Useless Phrases, 'A social art project collecting anonymous phrases and placing them back to their said location to ease the burden of toxic language'. The project was created by two MFA students from Photography in Art 210 utilizing a story map they made on Arc-GIS Online; a project that was made possible in large-part by the Wish You Were Here Arc GIS Workshop led Dr. Kerry Rohrmeier from the Geography Department at SJSU

Integration of Research, Service, and Teaching

Art 104 & Multigenerational Digital Stewardship Project

As a part of the research for my Knight funded Multigenerational Digital Stewardship Project, I'm working with the SJSU Martin Luther King Library to archive back issues of the journal SWITCH². The articles within the journal include a historical record of art and technology

produced within the region, providing research material for the exhibition that I will produce as a component of the grant. SWITCH also provides a beautiful history of web design and critical thinking about the impact of technology coming from SJSU students as well as external contributors like Sadie Plant, Alexander Galloway, Manual Delandia and others, but the journal was never indexed nor is it searchable; making it hard to use as a research tool and rendering it nearly invisible to the external research community.

Collaboration with MLK Library

I approached SJSU Martin Luther King Library to see if they were interested in archiving the journal SWITCH on Scholarworks³. They agreed and as part of this process we decided to engage students enrolled in my ART 104: Interdisciplinary Seminar in Digital Media Art class to create augmented metadata. As a part of the curricular requirements, students produce abstracts, keywords, disciplines, and accessible versions of the articles in PDF format for volumes 1-18 of the journal. The metadata will eventually show up as previews in Google Searches and within academic repositories like WorldCat and Digital Commons.

Discussions and documentations of collaboration within a class context has yielded attention from across the field of library sciences and digital art including: 1) an accepted submission to peer reviewed platforms including the {code4lib} Journal 2) a presentation at ISEA (International Symposium of Electronic Art).

Scaffolding for the Knight Grant

The archiving of SWITCH Journal is part of the *Multigenerational Digital Stewardship Project, a* collaborative inter-institutional project funded by the Knight Foundation to create an XR & blockchain certificate enabled digital database that will archive, index, lend, and exhibit

complex digital objects using a web-based platform that expands the current capabilities of the virtual 3D exhibition platform New Art City.

External Engagement & Discoverability of Research at SJSU

This hand-on experience will produce outcomes that have 'real world' impacts for future researchers, while also providing insight into the ways algorithms and metadata influence what is visible on the web and what remains hidden. At the same time, the students are building better research habits by reverse engineering the process. The abstracts produced for Scholarworks will help make the rich treasure trove of research within SWITCH discoverable by a wider community; many early SWITCH Journal contributors like Manuel DeLanda, Sadie Plant, and Alex Galloway have gone on to contribute substantially to their research fields.

Documentation of Significance of SJSU & CADRE Media Lab within the field of New Media Art

Another component of the *Multigeneration Digital Stewardship Project* will preserve and archive several important bodies of digital media produced within the Silicon Valley in 1984-2014. The archive will focus on complex digital objects (with special attention to XR and 3D files), and collaborative research from the CADRE Media Lab at San José State University, SWITCH Journal, Leonardo/ISAST, ZERO1, and the San José Museum of Art archive/collections. in her external letter of professional review Tanya Zimabardo, curator of New Media at the San Francisco Museum of Modern art explains,

Holberton's exciting representation in a range of exhibitions, and past participation in high profile, discursive public programs, are indicative of her academic rigor and her involvement within a broader network of artists and scholars. Her forthcoming research and plans around the archives of the renowned SJSU CADRE Laboratory for New Media will make its

contributions relevant to new students and renewed interest internationally from the field.⁴

Collaboration with External Artists & San José Museum of Art

Tamiko Theil & the San José Museum of Art have both agreed to let SJSU reauthor an artwork of Tamiko's in the museum's collection, Beyond Manzanar. The artwork currently runs only on an archived version of Windows on a special computer that Tamiko setup for the museum. I have offered to work with students to reauthor the piece using New Art City, which utilizes web-stable languages and runs on any browser on any computer. It is likely that I will run this through a class, so that students can receive course credit for real-world collaborative experience while interacting closely with professionals in the field. I recently held a meeting with Lynn Hershman Leeson who will also be participating in the reathoring component of the project with my collaborator at Leonardo, Vanessa Chang.

Student Mentorship

In addition to the curricular engagement, I am also working with several undergraduate students in a mentorship capacity to produce 2 prototypes to test the 3D exhibition and database management components of the project:⁵

Black Spartans: In recognition of Black History Month, February 2022, University Archivist Carli Lowe and Special Collections Librarian Kate Steffens are launching a digital exhibit of the resources illustrating experiences and achievements of San José State's earliest Black students, 1907-1948. As a component of the exhibition the library wanted to create a series of portraits, I

recommended a Digital Media Art BFA student who is working with me on the Digital Stewardship project, Yeab Kebede, who turned black and white images of the students into compelling digital portraits. We will eventually build a parallel version of the digital exhibition on New Art City to compare features of the identical exhibition currently hosted by the digital archiving platform, Islandora.

Kawakami House: San Jose Japantown's own story can be told through the lives of the family through immersive and personalized storytelling in VR. The Kawakami House located on the property of the San Jose Japanese American Museum can be used to tell the story of our community through the life of the family who lived within it. The Kawakami family witnessed a remarkable number of events that are typically used to characterize the Japanese American experience. This project will focus on those with relevance for our society and the challenges it is facing today to expand and deepen civil liberties education for the students & visitors to the San Jose Japanese American Museum. I am currently working with two Digital Media Art BFA to produce the exhibition in collaboration with the Director of the Thompson Gallery, Alena Sauzade and stakeholders from the Japanese American Museum in San José. One of the students was awarded a Student Grant Research Initiative (SGRI) for her work with me on VR & Accessibility.

Impact within the Field

My collaborators at the MLK Library documented the archiving process of Switch Journal. They posted their findings and their code to an open-source repository on Github. We discuss the process and student engagement in a journal article published by the peer-reviewed online journal code4lib⁶ and presented our work at the ISEA Conference in Summer 2022.





In the summer of 2021 I taught a course, Art 175, in which SJSU students worked collaboratively with the Curators and Digital Development team at the San Jose Museum of Art to create an interpretive online experience for Hito Steyerl's Factory of the Sun Installation which opened August 6, 2021. Under my supervision, students worked with the curator of the exhibition, Kathryn Wade, to create an interpretive analytical framework of Factory of the Sun. The interpretive framework will be used to design an interactive online experience for the public to help the exhibition "come to life" through active visitor involvement.






The Identity Factory, produced in Summer 21 Art 175




<u>The Making of the Identity Factory</u>: Interview with SJMA curator, Professor Holberton, and SJSU Students

One of my students had to say this of the class in their evaluations, "Professor Holberton has many strengths in terms of her teaching style. In this class in particular, she was extremely willing to help, whether it be through staying after class, supporting me individually through email correspondence or sending me a myriad of tutorials to help me understand the programs I was using to a level that I could actually work with them. I feel like Professor Holberton also had a great understanding of teaching virtually, which was extremely important in this class in particular as it was an entirely digital environment leading towards digital production throughout. I thought the style of creating slides and presenting them to the class as well as the NAC / SJMA team we were working with was very helpful. It led to us being able to present with more clarity and comfort when we eventually had to do more formal presentations later in the class."

Several other students spoke to the unique and experimental nature of the Summer 2021 Art 175 course, 'The course was very successful in my opinion, this class was different then other classes I have enrolled in.' and 'This class was extremely experimental, she told us that from the beginning, yet despite that caveat it was taught and executed in a really fantastic way.'

In addition to the exposure to professional collaborative pipelines, this class also tested new pipelines of production. In many of my classes I create tutorials for my students that document production pipelines that I troubleshoot in my studio practice. In a student review of my Fall 2021 Art 102 class they said, "Rhonda makes very good use of video tutorials and walkthroughs of a very complicated and finicky program. She also gave the class the opportunity at the beginning of the semester to choose which program we would be learning, and having that sort of control over my education was empowering. She was also always willing to troubleshoot with students both on and offline, in a way which felt like she was invested in our success."






I usually also publish the content publicly for our larger community. It is clear from the video comments that my integration of teaching, service, and research is having a positive impact well beyond the walls of our university.
